Every month, we share ideas from the field, the latest news on the project and examples of how Music & Memory is changing lives.


Now Playing: Alive Inside!

In its final year, the CAHF project is spreading the word about Music & Memory by hosting six screenings of the documentary film, *Alive Inside* throughout the state. Our third screening is next month in **Orange, CA**.

Alive Inside is a documentary film that explores the transformative impact of music on people suffering from dementia and other cognitive disorders.

The award winning documentary follows the journey of social worker Dan Cohen, the creator of the national Music & Memory program which helps non-verbal dementia patients re-ignite positive memories as they listen to familiar songs from their past.

TIME: Event begins at 6:30. Panel discussion to follow immediately after film. Participants include Ron Jordan, Dean of the School of Pharmacy; Dr. Joshua Grill, PhD, Co-Director UCI Mind; and representatives from local Music & Memory programs.

The screening is sponsored by the <u>California Association of Health Facilities</u> (CAHF) with support from <u>Alzheimer's Orange County</u>, <u>Music & Memory</u>, <u>Rockport Healthcare Services</u>, <u>UCI MIND: Institute for Memory Impairments and Neurological Disorders</u>, and <u>Chapman University's School of Pharmacy</u> and <u>Dodge College of Film and Media Arts</u>.

The screening is **free** and **open to the public**.
