ABOUT THE PROGRAM

The Nursing Home Leader Academy of Excellence (NHLAE) is a nine-month program offering an opportunity for forty exceptional nursing home leaders to advance the expertise necessary to achieve and sustain quality in their skilled-nursing settings. The goal of this innovative program is to prepare nursing home administrators and Nurse Leaders in California to successfully compete in the rapidly changing world of post-acute care.

NHLAE is designed to expand leadership skills and increase quality-improvement competencies. Academy participants will learn to apply evidence-based quality assurance, performance-improvement, (QAPI) techniques, and cutting-edge post-acute leadership practices to their own skilled-nursing settings.

The nine-month curriculum will offer an active learning experience, combining didactic instruction from nationally recognized experts, dynamic learning activities, and peer support from a web-based resource community. Academy participants will develop their own action plan for achieving success in clinical outcomes for residents, better staff stability, lower hospital readmissions, and other relevant quality areas.

PROGRAM SCHEDULE

The schedule itself includes three in-person sessions covering a variety of topics taught by expert faculty, webinars, online peer discussion, and "action focused" support to help extend the momentum throughout the Academy.
