Nursing Home Incident Command (NHICS): Major Earthquake Inject #1

9:30 AM There has been a new development. Minutes ago, a local law enforcement officer arrived at the front door and states the main gas line in the street has broken and a building across the street has caught fire. There is severe damage to the neighborhood’s infrastructure and the authorities are ordering an immediate evacuation. He states that some major roads are severely damaged by the earthquake, and it will probably be several hours before response agencies can send specialized transportation. Additionally, six staff who live in the threatened area have left to secure their children and or pets.
