



California's 1,200 skilled nursing facilities (SNFs) provide critical care to approximately **350,000 patients** a year. Our services range from assistance with essential daily activities to 24-hour supervision and medical care for the sickest and most frail.

The average age of nursing care patients is 75 years old, with mobility and cognitive conditions.

Intermediate Care Facilities (ICFs) provide 24-hour care to individuals with developmental disabilities.

Despite caring for our most vulnerable population, Medi-Cal reimburses nursing care providers **\$38 LESS** than the actual cost of care per patient per day.
