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Patient Needs Waivers (PNWs) and	
Workforce Shortage Waivers (WSWs)	-
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§ 72329.2. Nursing Service - Staff.	
(a) Each facility, except those skilled nursing facilities that are a distinct part of a general acute care facility or a state-owned hospital or developmental center, shall employ sufficient nursing	
staff to provide a minimum of 3.5 direct care service hours per patient day, except as set forth in Health and Safety Code section 1276.9. Skilled nursing facilities shall provide a minimum of 2.4	
certified nurse assistant hours per patient day to meet the requirements of this subdivision.	
(1) Facilities that are a distinct part of a general acute care facility or a state-owned hospital or developmental center shall continue to meet the standard set forth in Health and Safety Code	
section 1276.5.	
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(2) Facilities which provide care for persons with mental health disorders and in which psychiatric technicians provide patient care shall meet the following standards:	
(A) For patients not certified for special treatment programs, facilities shall employ	
sufficient staff to provide a minimum of 3.5 direct care service hours per patient day.	
(B) For patients certified for special treatment programs, facilities shall employ sufficient	
staff to provide a minimum of 2.3 nursing hours per patient day for each patient certified to the special treatment program, exclusive of additional staff required to meet	
the staffing standards of the special treatment program.

 Submit application and/or update and resubmit annually no later than April 1st of the proceeding fiscal year 	
Waiver application must be submitted to the Department <u>using only</u>	
the Department's online application	
 The California Department of Public Health (CDPH) has implemented a new online process for SNFs requesting approval for PNWs and WSWs. 	
CDPH Flex Waiver webpage

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- The application must be complete by April $1^{\mathfrak{A}}$, if there is missing information, the application is not complete and CDPH will not accept it after April $1^{\mathfrak{A}}$
- The April 1^{st} deadline is in place so that the applications can be processed and effective July 1^{st} .
- The department will post on their website approved waivers for fiscal year 2019-2020 and beyond no later than July $30^{\rm th}$ each year.

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PNWs

To request a waiver for a facility that <u>does not have a subacute care unit</u> approved by the Department of Health Care Services or for portions of a facility not approved as a subacute care unit by the Department of Health Care Services:

 The average daily census at the facility, excluding any patients in a subacute care unit approved by the Department of Health Care Services.

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PNWs

- A copy of the facility's Minimum Data Set Facility Level Quality Measure Report and Minimum Data Set Facility Characteristics Report, dated no earlier than 30 days prior to submission of the waiver application.
- The level of direct caregiver staffing the facility will provide if granted a waiver, including the number and type of staff.
- An analysis of the resident needs at the facility, including a description of the assessment tools used, how the tools were applied, and the outcomes used to determine resident needs.

To request a waiver for a subacute care unit approved	
by the Department of Health Care Services:	
 A current, valid contract with the Department of Health Care Services to provide subacute care.

• The most recent audit findings from the Department	
of Health Care Services related to determining compliance with the staffing requirements set forth	
in title 22, California Code of Regulations, division 3, section 51215.5.	
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<u>PNWs</u>	
Reminders	
 A facility may request a waiver to address individual patient needs as long as the facility continues to meet the minimum 3.5 direct care service hour requirement. When evaluating waiver requests, the Department shall consider: 	
 when evaluating waiver requests, the Department shall consider: The substantiating information submitted by the facility. Resident quality of care at the facility. 	
The facility's compliance history.The needs and acuity levels of residents at the facility.	
 If there is a change in the information submitted, the facility shall notify the Department within 15 days of the change. 	

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- The Department may revoke approval of a patient needs waiver at any time
 if the facility does not comply with the terms and conditions of the waiver
 and the Department determines that the non-compliance poses a significant
 risk to the health, safety, or welfare of patients.
- If the Department denies a waiver application, cannot appeal the decisionmust wait until the subsequent fiscal year to reapply.

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PNWs

The facility shall post the letter of acknowledgement from the Department confirming receipt of a waiver request, as a notice of a pending waiver application. The notice shall be posted immediately adjacent to the facility's license.

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PNWs

A facility with an approved waiver must post the waiver immediately adjacent to the facility's license.

Facilities shall provide written notice of approved or pending waivers to all residents prior to execution of an admission agreement. The notice shall be either a true copy of the approval letter or a letter from the Department acknowledging receipt of a waiver request.

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FY 2018-2019

Approved waivers are posted

- They retro back to July 1, 2018
- They expire June 30, 2019
- Reapply and/or annually by April 1st of the preceding FY

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WSWs

FY 2019-2020 and beyond

- Submit application no later than April 1st of the proceeding fiscal year
- The facility can submit a written request for a waiver with substantiating
 information to the Department via email RNUnit@cdph.ca.gov or by mail to

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WSWs

- The application period <u>is only open from January 1st to April 1st for each application year;</u> CDPH will not accept applications submitted outside of this timeframe

and direct caregivers-as long as the facility continues to meet the 3.2

Department will not grant more than two consecutive waiver renewals.	
 Post a notice of a pending waiver application in a public location. 	
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WSWs	
Notify potential residents of a pending waiver application prior to	
admission. Department will send facility an acknowledgement letter.	
Approved waiver must be posted in a public location within the facility and	
provide written notice to potential residents prior to admission.	
 If the Department denies a waiver application, cannot appeal the decision- must wait until the subsequent fiscal year to reapply. 	
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<u>WSWs</u>	
Not eligible if in the preceding 3 years:	
• Issuance of two or more A citations if operated by the same	
owner at the time of waiver application; or	
 Issuance of one or more AA citations if operated by the same owner at the time of waiver application; or 	
License suspended or revoked if operated by the same	
owner at the time of waiver application.	
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<u>WSWs</u>	
Waiver can be revoked for one of the following:	
 The Department may terminate the waiver if it determines the facility does not meet the terms of the waiver. 	
 Substantiated findings of substandard quality of care related to insufficient staffing; 	
 Issuance of an A or AA citation; or Quality of care violations with a scope and severity of G or higher.
