Health Workforce Development

Improve health care access by providing scholarships, loan repayments, and grants to students and institutions providing direct patient care in areas of unmet need



CNA Workforce Development

- Grant to Empowered Aging to implement CNA health career pathway program
- Grant to LeadingAgeCA to expand programs with a goal of adding 2,700 new CNA/HHA to the workforce
- Opened Allied Health Scholarship Program offering scholarships for CNA students
- Health Professions Pathways Program supports building allied health/CNA pipeline programs

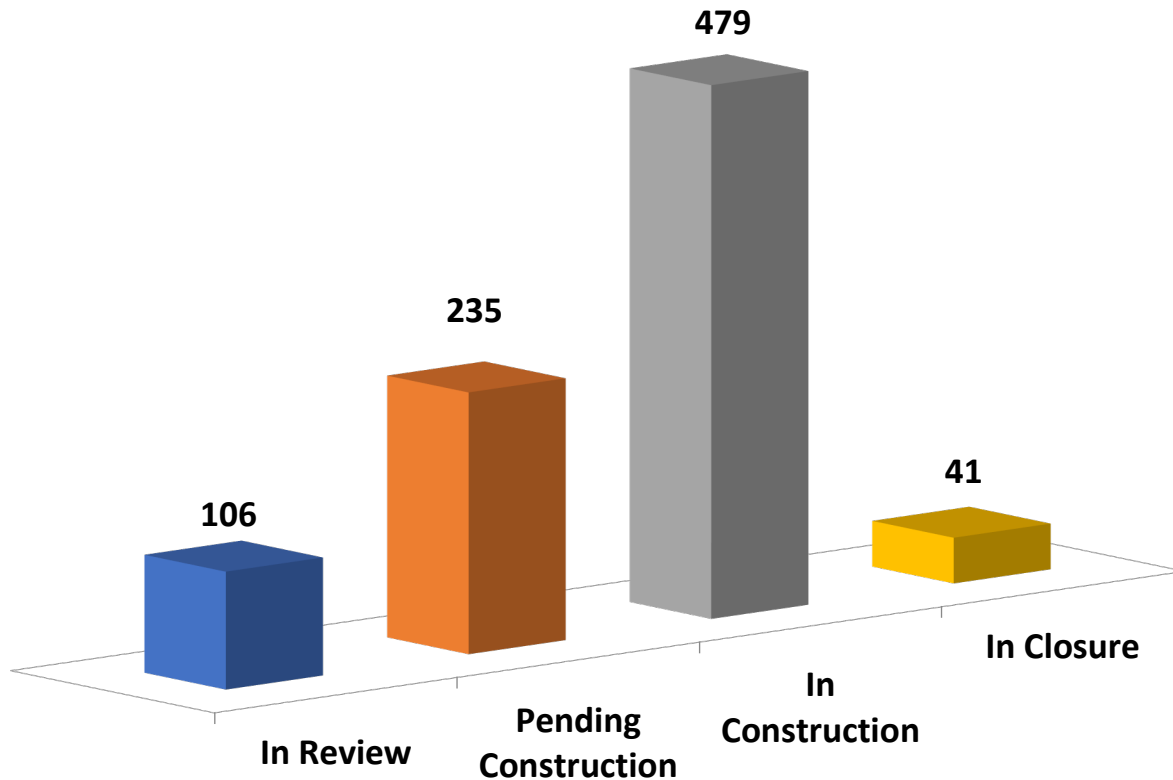
HCAI is the building department for California's Skilled Nursing (SNF) and Intermediate Care facilities (ICF). HCAI is responsible for overseeing:

Information Services

HCAI is one of the state's major hubs of health care information, collecting and hosting trusted, publicly available data on health care costs, health workforce capacity, health care facilities, and patient characteristics



Information Services Highlights and Updates

Long Term-Care Facility Reports

- Annual Utilization Report collected from over 1,370 facilities
- LTC Facility Integrated Disclosure and Medi-Cal Cost Report

Will be proposing to separate Medicare and Medi-Cal Managed Care as separate categories, with regulations to be available for public comment later this year.

Information Services Highlights and Updates

SB 650 Implementation - Skilled Nursing Facilities

- Q1 2023 Outreach to SNFs regarding requirements of consolidated reporting
- Q4 2023 Complete regulations and configure HCAI data collection reporting platform
- Q1 2024 initial collection of consolidated reports

Monitoring **AB 2079** SNF direct care spending requirement

Cal-Mortgage

Cal-Mortgage insures loans for the construction and expansion of eligible nonprofit or governmental healthcare facilities, such as hospitals, clinics, and long-term care facilities



Cal-Mortgage Highlights

- 69% of Cal Mortgage's current loan portfolio is to multi-level senior living facilities licensed as Residential Care for the Elderly or Continuing Care Retirement Communities
- The current insured loan balance is nearly \$1.1 billion (33 loans) for senior living facility projects

Office of Health Care Affordability

The Office will analyze the health care market for cost trends and drivers of spending, enforce health care cost targets set by a new Health Care Affordability Board. We will measure key indicators to ensure we are achieving a high value system.



Key Activities

- Increase **public transparency on total health care spending** in the state
- Publish an **annual report on health care spending trends**
- Establish the Health Care Affordability Board which will **set a statewide cost target and eventually sector targets**
- **Promote and measure quality and equity through performance reporting**

Access to Reproductive Health Care Services \$120M

- Capital to secure physical and digital infrastructure to facilities providing reproductive health services
- Uncompensated Care fund for abortion services
- Support to expand reproductive health providers by increasing scholarship and loan repayment programs and training opportunities
- California Reproduction Health Service Corps
- Abortion Practical Support Fund

Workforce for a Healthy California for All Initiatives

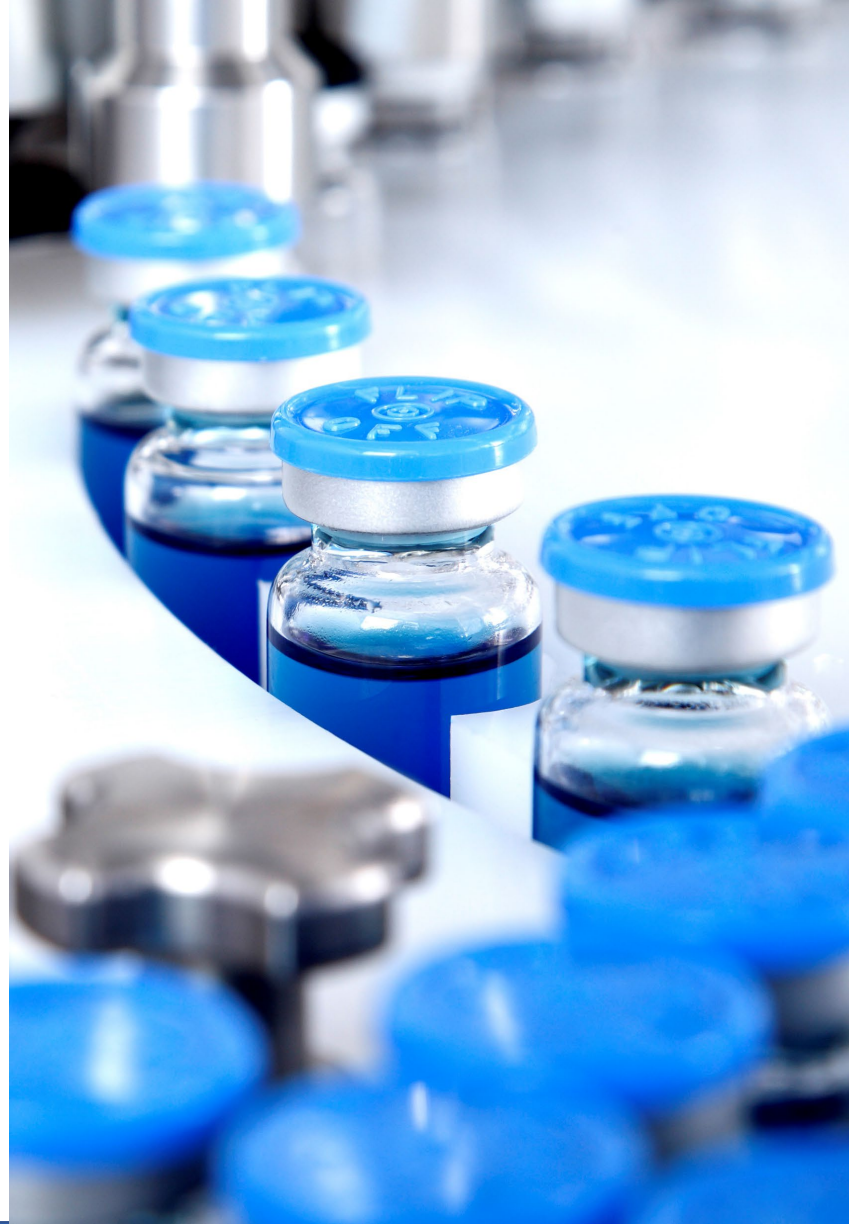
- **Community Health Workers/Promotores** \$281M to recruit, train, and certify new CHW/Ps
- **Nursing Initiative** \$220M over 3 years to increase the number of RN, LVN, CNA, CNMW, CMA, FNP, and other health professions
- **Social Work Initiative** \$126M over 3 years to build the diversity and supply of licensed social workers
- **Behavioral Health Workforce Investments**

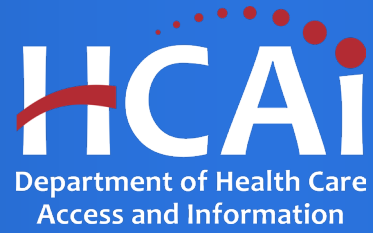
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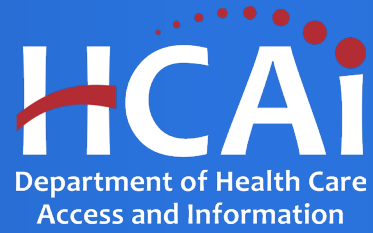
