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Do any of these legislators hold important positions in the legislature? If so, what are those positions?

Senator Menjivar is Chair of the Senate Budget and Fiscal Review Subcommittee No. 3 on Health and Human Services. In the role of Chair, Sen. Menjivar is tasked with hearing and reviewing all fiscal legislation impacting healthcare in the Senate.

Assemblymember Pacheco sits on the Assembly Appropriations Committee and the Assembly Judiciary Committee.

What interactions has CAHF had with these legislators?

Assemblymember Irwin knows CAHF very well as she was the author of AB 2511 which required SNFs to have 96 hours of backup power via generator in 2024 and 2025. The bill did make it out of the legislature but was vetoed by the Governor. Asm. Irwin has toured Mary Health of the Sick and met with CAHF members during Spring Advocacy in 2024.

Assemblymember Pacheco was the author of CAHF's sponsored bill AB 2096 (2026).

Sen. Menjivar is very familiar with CAHF as she, and her staff, have met with CAHF members during Spring Advocacy in 2024, 2025, and 2026. Additionally, she has toured Ararat Nursing Facility and participated in CAHF PAC dinner events in 2024 and 2025.

Senator Strickland grew up working in a Skilled Nursing Facility and is close friends with Phil Chase (ReNew).

How can the chapter get more involved with the legislators who represent the chapter?

There are many opportunities to reach out to the legislators representing your chapter. Here are a few ideas to get started:

- Follow legislators on social media
 - Know about their upcoming constituent events

- Follow their legislation
 - Foster a relationship with your legislator online
- Invite legislators to chapter meetings
 - Connect them with providers and suppliers in their district
 - Share key legislative updates
- Host a facility tour
 - Showcase resident care and services
 - Introduce legislators to residents and staff
 - Highlight the impact of long-term care in their community
- Celebrate resident and staff milestones
 - Notify district offices about milestone birthdays and staff anniversaries
 - Invite legislators or staff to participate in recognition events

What is the best way to connect with the legislators who represent my chapter?

The best way to invite your legislator to an event would be to send an email with all of the pertinent details of your request (What is the event? When is the event? What is expected of the legislator?). If you don't have a contact for a legislative office, the best thing to do is to call the district office and ask where to send an invitation for an event in their district.
